Our Kids Ministry is called "Lighthouse" here at Calvary because we know that Jesus is the "Light of the World" and when we follow him we reflect that "Light" (his love) into the parts of our world that remain in darkness. This is our calling;

- To know God, Jesus and Holy Spirit
- Receive the love he has for each of us
- Share that love with others

This is our goal in Lighthouse and we seek to meet this goal by:

- Teaching our kids through the curriculum that we write and develop here at Calvary
- Giving our kids space to meet with, talk to and

hear God each time they come to Lighthouse (we call this time our 11 O'clock STOP)

• Creating a community of learners and believers that models family where we recognize we are growing and maturing as followers of Jesus together

This year was a year of transitioning back into *in person* kids ministry on Sunday mornings. From January until June we had small group opportunities for 4 age groups (JK-SK, Gr 1-3, Gr 3-5, Gr 6-8. Through hallway board games, object lessons, science experiments and other fun we explored the following themes:

- Jesus is the Light of the world and he calls us to be the light
- the Easter story
- God is a good creator
- God calls us to be on mission with him

In the summer we transitioned into one large group open to kids from JK- Grade 8. We met in our outdoor classroom space and did a BLAST THRU THE BIBLE where we literally took the kids chronologically through the Bible to highlight that it is one big story that points to Jesus.

In September we renamed and restructured our age groups to better accommodate the groups' size. SonSeekers (JK-Grade 1) meet in the newly decorated "SonRoom", TrailBlazers (Grade 2-5) meet in the Kingdom Room, and Jr Youth meet in the Jr Youth lounge . The fall of 2022 we felt able to return to Big Group Worship once a month which has included worship and a drama with some hilarious pirates who are on a journey to find the world's "greatest treasure". We loved our Blast thru the Bible in the summer and decided to use this idea for our 2022-23 Lighthouse year. We are moving chronologically through the stories and characters of the Bible asking ourselves these questions:

- What does this story reveal about God?
- What does this story reveal about us?

We have an **amazing Kid's Ministry team here at Calvary**! In speaking with kids ministry pastors in the region I know other churches have seen a sharp decline in their kids ministry











volunteers as a result of covid. We have not. Our team is as large and as strong as

ever. **Thank you** to our worship and drama teams as well as all of our Lighthouse leaders and mentors who consistently show up and pour themselves into loving and discipling our kids.

At Calvary, the heart of missions is to both partner with agencies that embody this call and also to come alongside, encourage and empower individuals who have a heart and a call to GO! Partnering and coming alongside agencies and people might include financial support, prayer support and/or volunteer

In addition Calvary supports the United Church's Mission and Outreach ministries which meet local and global needs.

GO! Local

DTK - Downtown Kitchener Ministry

Calvary has continued to serve the marginalized people in Kitchener every other Tuesday night from 8-9pm. We were excited to see construction complete at City Hall allowing us to return to using that location as our home base. While the team offers a bite to eat, a warm beverage, and a few essential items,

the real heart is to build relationships, demonstrate the love of God and offer the hope of Jesus to

whoever stops by. Our team typically consists of 4-6 people to serve food and hand out hygiene and personal items and 3 people to walk the streets with hot chocolate and a willingness to connect with people wherever they are - offering a warm drink, prayer and words of truth, hope and encouragement.

In November of 2022 we started gathering at 7PM to offer "Simple Church" to any interested guests. We have had a growing number of people join us for connection, bible reading and prayer. Each week we hear testimonies from guests who have found community and receive hope through the DTK ministry!

A crucial part of this ministry is the ongoing support of you our Calvary family. Thanks to LDC and our Jr Youth who baked and packaged cookies to give out over the Christmas season! We need both team members and the donations of practical resources to support and sustain this ministry. Please connect with Kelly Beitz to get more information, to volunteer with this ministry opportunity or support it with a donation.

Every Disciple Sent

June 7-11 Calvary was host to an equipping and training school run by Every Disciple Sent. This ministry is an initiative started by our friends and partners at Disciple a City with the heart of training and equipping believers to fulfill the great commission of sharing the gospel. Kelly and Rhonda both use some of their time to specifically support EDS events happening across Canada and help them develop the coaching initiative within this ministry. The school in June trained over 30

participants in tools like the 3 circles, 15 second testimony, prayer and simple church. Many of our own Calvary helped host and participated in this week long school. We look forward to continuing to partner with this ministry as they launch events and schools across the country!

Jakobstettel House

In June of 2022 a community group came together to transform the previous Jakobstettel Inn into a 10room transitional home called "Woolwich Guest House" for Ukrainian Refugees in transition. The task was great and many Calvary hands pitched in with their time and giftings to help meet the goal. The home now provides supportive transitional housing

for Ukrainians displaced from their homeland due to the war. In August of 2022 Calvary was approached by the Woolwich House and asked to support the food needs of the families by donating \$25 gift cards to Walmart and Food Basics. Thanks to the generous support of our Calvary family we were able to drop off \$1225 worth of cards to the home to be used by families as they transition through the home! What a tangible way of meeting the needs of others right in our own community!

Light in the Park

This "Drop In" style GO! Ministry started in 2021 and continued in both the summer and fall of 2022. Light in the Park takes some simple truths about God (He is good, You are loved, Jesus is the way and Nothing is impossible) and uses games and activities in a local park to share the gospel and build relationships with our local community.

The Light in the Park initiative received a grant for \$3000 from United Possibility Funds which allowed us to hire a team of youth to grow the ministry and use it as an

opportunity to disciple our youth! Kelly Beitz and Amy Gayman welcomed Gavin Beitz, Victoria Gayman and Maria Martin to the team in the summer and they ministered to families out of Valley View Park in the new subdivision of St Jacobs. Then in September we welcomed Emmaline Henry to the team and they ministered to families out of Riverside Park. Just before Thanksgiving the team set up downtown St Jacobs to give away free pumpkins, share a message of God's goodness and offer prayer to people. This structure for building relationships and sharing the gospel was widely successful and many connections were made with both local families and visitors to the area. We were able to share the truth of God's love to many and were able to pray with a number of individuals and families.

Ray of Hope

Calvary served three meals in March, June and September at Ray of Hope during the 2022 year with the financial support of this church family. Every time we served, the protocols changed but now we know that this can easily happen and we "go with the flow". We have found that with all the changes and protocols it has become easier to collect monetary donations instead of actual food items, and then

we purchase the items needed. We are always amazed and delighted when the grocery bill and the donations are within a few dollars of each other. Our good good God is a generous provider and you, our church family are His vehicle!

We have committed to three meals again in 2023. We have been so grateful for the support from the Calvary family. This team truly enjoys preparing and working together to serve the Ray of Hope community.

Ukrainian Backpacks

Thanks to the leadership and coordination of Brenda Tithecott, Calvary had the opportunity to help support a local Waterloo Region Grassroots Response to the Ukrainian Crisis team. In April, 25 backpacks filled with elementary level school supplies (lunch bags, pencil cases, markers and more) were purchased and donated to the team to provide









to families when they arrived in the region. A huge thank you to our generous Calvary family and to Brenda for coordinating this effort!

United Church Camping Ministries

We were thrilled in 2022 to see Ryerson and Silver Lake reopen and resume overnight camping ministry this past summer! We were excited to both encourage Calvary families to attend these "partner camps" and to see many of our Calvary youth go to be on staff as part of the ministering teams. In the spring, a Calvary team went up to Silver Lake to finish the project of building new tent bases for the wilderness program on site 2. We also saw many of our congregation spend time this spring and summer at Silver Lake helping with various projects to keep the site at Silver Lake looking good and functioning well.

In the fall of 2021, Calvary was approached by Silver Lake to consider formally partnering with their ministry by committing to a more consistent financial contribution. The board approved this and has committed to a monthly line donation to Silver Lake Camp. These consistent contributions will assist with the ongoing needs of operating a camp ministry but will also support the build of a much needed dining hall. Calvary is continuing to consider ways to bless, encourage and strengthen the camp ministries that so many of our own youth and families enjoy and benefit from.

In addition, Leadership Development Camp - LDC (co-directed by Rhonda Elgersma) was able to operate as a full camp again this past summer. We had the honour of hosting them for a few days as they designed and ran a youth service out of Calvary. In addition to providing a great space for this sized camp, our Calvary family also came together to provide the food for their stay here. This very tangible gift of shelter and food is such a blessing to this small traveling camp.









GO! International

Missionary Couple

Calvary continues to financially and spiritually support a young missionary couple (names withheld for safety reasons) from our region that have a heart to serve the muslim people. For the last few years this couple has served in Jordan and have recently moved back to Canada to access services for their daughter. As leadership, we have had the privilege of meeting with this couple to share testimonies, pray for and encourage them. They have also come to Calvary this past summer to speak and share about their learnings, their passion for Jesus and the muslim people as well as their passion for sharing the gospel. Our leadership team has recently been asked to sit on a discernment team as this couple comes before God to ask what is next for them as a family. Please pray for their team in Jordan, their work with Muslim believers in Jordan and in KW, and for their daughter's health and development. God has greatly blessed us with His provision for this passion of ours. Did you know we have been sponsoring refugees continually since 2015 when we sponsored Alia, Diyaa, and Ibrahim? Thank you for sharing our heart for refugees as we follow Jesus. With your help, we have impacted the lives of 35 people!

We facilitated the paperwork for 2 more of Alia's children - Maysa arrived in September 2022 and Mohammad in January 2023. Maysa is single and she lives with Alia and other family members. Mohammad, his wife Amal, and boys Yazan and Abdel Rahman are living in Kitchener near their other family members.

The application to bring Venus & Aphrodite's family to Canada from Lebanon is being processed overseas but that could take another 2 years or more. Please join us in praying for a speedy resolution so this family can be reunited and come to safety in Canada.

In partnership with a Waterloo family, we are sponsoring their extended family from Somalia. This sponsorship is a real God story - ask us about it! Weli and his seven children have been living as refugees in Uganda since 2009. They are oppressed and discriminated against which makes it difficult to work. Their application is currently being processed in Canada prior to being sent overseas.



Because of the changing nature of refugee sponsorship, we are also focusing on being financially prepared for our next sponsorship. In previous years, sponsors were able to submit an application and raise funds while waiting for the sponsored family to arrive. Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) now requires sponsors to have the funds upfront before application is made. Being financially prepared will allow us to act quickly when we're presented with our next sponsorship opportunity.

Please pray for wisdom as we move forward with this work.
